Our next event is the TYC Opening Regatta, the kick-off for the Club Champion series. This is a series of five regattas through the year - Opening (usually April), May Day (usually May), Charter Day (late May, early June), Leen ("Lane") Polderman (Sept or Oct) and Commodore's (early November). The dates are planned ahead but subject to change and so **Sunday May 5th is the Opening Regatta**. These weekend events usually start at 10AM; we try to do three races; then head back to the club. For some of these regattas we have stuff at the club after - like May Day is usually the day of the Fleet Blessing and Crawfish Boil and sometimes we coordinate the Leen Polderman or Commodore's Regatta with a pig roast. Like the WedNite Series II, the TYC Club Champion series is also comprised of Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker divisions.



The month of April brought our sailors out on the water. The first spring series brought great evening conditions. There was not a weather cancellation during the series. Beautiful sunsets, full moons and some cool nights gave the sailors the opportunity to enjoy the midweek racing. Check out the action photos to feel the thrill of racing.

This month brings sad news to TYC. One of our founding members, Luis Tonizzo has passed away. Guy Geller has written a moving tribute to the skills of this remarkable sailor. Please be sure to take a few minutes to read Guy's article. I gained a better understanding of the formative years of our club. Our thoughts and prayers go to Luis's wife, Jeanne, and family.

Sail camp is one month away. If you have children, grandchildren or neighbors with interested kids, sign up is under way. The website has all of the information necessary. I have included a few extra tidbits for those not familiar with the program.





A life well lived!

To those who knew Captain Luis Tonizzo it saddens me to tell you that Saturday (4/20/19) I received information that he passed away from a heart attack on Good Friday. Luis was a founding member of TYC. He put Tammany Yacht Club on the world sailing map by competing in the 1980 OSTAR (Observer Single Handed Transatlantic Race) and later in the 1984 OSTAR where he won Class IV. Slidell attorney Jim Bates, also a TYC member competed in the 1984 OSTAR and placed third in Class IV.

Luis, a professional ship's Captain, sailed his Dufour 27 named Egret from Slidell to Newport, RI to Plymouth, England to qualify as a competitor in the 1980 OSTAR from England back to Newport. The shortest great circle route if attainable is 2810 nautical miles. He finished in 33 days, 5 hours and 25 minutes, placing seventh in Class J. He received numerous accolades for his successful finish including a proclamation from the Louisiana Secretary of the Senate representing the Governor.

TYC did not yet have a bona fide club house so the presentation was made from the bed of a pickup truck on the side of Liberty Marine by then founding Commodore Guy Geller. During his acceptance speech Luis Tonizzo vowed he would build a 35 foot boat, compete in 1984 and win Class IV. He did both; winning his class in 20 days, 23 hours 40 minutes! Jim Bates finished 3rd in 22 days, 18 hours and 9 minutes aboard Big Shot, a modified J35. TYC, the upstart little yacht club on the Bayou did very well among world class single handed sailors in boats of up to 56 feet. Luis was credited with the shortest route traveled of the 91 boats that started the race.

Luis Tonizzo was born in Argentina, attended the U. S. Merchant Marine Academy in KingsPointe, NY. He was the Navigator on numerous ships traveling the world while honing his skills. When not aboard ships, he lived in Slidell with his parents until he and Guy Geller (Rusty) managed to pay for an apartment on Bayou Bonfouca until Rusty married his high school sweetheart. Luis traveled all of the oceans on Merchant Ships and rose to the rank and responsibility of Ship's Captain. He and his wife Jeanne owned and operated the SilkRoad Trading Company, Inc. on Front Street specializing in Oriental rugs and memorabilia. They moved to Maine a number of years ago where Jeanne still resides. While there Luis suffered a number of health problems which he defeated to return to the sea which he loved.

His demise came about as he was docking a ship during a tremendous storm; the successful docking completed he suffered a heart attack and died at the age of 72. Those who knew him will miss him: those who did not know him would have had a more complete life if they had.

Frequently Asked Questions Sail Camp

Why does TYC hold sail camp?

Sail camp is the future of our club. You have heard this at every general membership meeting. Living in a waterfront community, sail camp gives children an opportunity to learn basic and advanced water safety skills as well as learn to sail. Sail camp is also a large contributor to the overall budget of TYC. For several years after Katrina, we did not have sail camp. It has been through the efforts and support of members that the camp has been reestablished.

Where is sail camp held?

The side yard is the storage yard for the sail camp boats. The camp is held in the yacht club , the yard, and on the water—basin and lake.

What is the age for campers?

Campers as young as 7 have enrolled. The average age is 9-14. More info is to be found on the Tammany website.

How long is sail camp?

Each session runs for two weeks. We have three sessions.

Who teaches sail camp?

Instructors have completed a certification course as outlined by US Sailing.

The 40+ hour course is comprehensive as to instruction methods for all ages and abilities. This year we will have instructors that have come through the ranks in the Tammany Sail Camp program. Congratulations to these outstanding young sailors!




