



#### From the Bar

Steve Pierce was born in Jackson, Mississippi, but moved to New Orleans at age six. He preferred to work on mechanical things, so school was not his favorite activity. After two years at Brother Martin High School, his parents transferred him to Holy Cross High School as a boarding student, largely because rulers across knuckles were part of Catholic nuns teaching method. [This could only happen in the Army.] His position as an Army Reservist allowed him to continue piloting while living in Lafayette. He worked with several oil field companies before settling into a permanent position with Union Oil Company. When Union Oil moved from Lafayette to Houston, Steve was told that he could either "move or stay and flip hamburgers". After consultation with Cathy, they chose to move, and lived in Clear Lake, Texas, where he began sailing a Catalina 30.


After 18 years of corporate flying and 20 years of flying with Southwest Airlines, Steve and Cathy decided to retire. They moved to Slidell to be nearer to Cathy's parents. According to Steve, Cathy is also responsible for their move from a Catalina 30 to "Second Wind", the Beneteau 361 that is a frequent sight on Lake Pontchartrain. Steve "gave up traveling at 500 knots to traveling at 5 knots", and he's comfortable with the change.

Steve and Cathy have been married for 52 years. They met at a New Year's Eve party, possibly because Steve brought a very large farm bell to ring in the New Year. Cathy was 19 and Steve 21 when they were married. They have three children and eight grandchildren. Quoting Steve, "I would not be who I am today, without Cathy's support."

Cathy stays busy with many things, but at the top of her list are children and grandchildren, and she spoils them in many ways. She also is a master chef and spends many hours in the kitchen preparing gourmet meals. When not in the kitchen, she enjoys sewing, gardening, traveling and even an occasional sail out on the lake.

You can usually tell when Steve and Cathy are at TYC by listening for Cathy's cheerful voice, often coming from the kitchen or from the bar, chatting with Steve and friends. We're fortunate to have them as TYC members.






