

### Racing Committee/LPRC Chairman





October was another full month for TYC racing. We wrapped up the **Wed Nite Fall Series**, hosted the **Single-Handed Round the Lake Regatta**, participated again in the **Pontchartrain YC Veteran's Regatta**, and concluded the month with the **LPRC Regatta**.

Next up in October was the Single-Handed Round the Lake – Saturday, October 14<sup>th</sup>. For our newer members, the SHR is one of the longest running short-handed regattas on Lake Pontchartrain. A single skipper crews the boat for a longer distance race. This year we had very good weather with a consistent breeze averaging 11 kts over a 24.2 NM course. The next event was the Veteran's Regatta hosted by Pontchartrain Yacht Club on Sunday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>.

This is one of our favorite regattas for s/v Strait Jacket, sailing under PYC/TYC flags. The event is a day of fun, food, music, boating and fund-raising for local veterans and their families. We hosted 6 Veterans and family members aboard this year and after years of second and third place finishes, we managed a win in light air conditions. Many smiles were seen all around. The event is open to anyone to bring your boat (sail or power) and bring some Veterans out on the water. Consider joining the fun next year.

Wrapping up October was the LPRC. To recap, this regatta involves all four yacht clubs on the lake plus the Corinthian Sailing Association. Annually, it is the last full weekend in October, rotates amongst the lake clubs and starts either on the south shore or the north shore. This was year 2 of a 4-year rotation of LPRC club venues and TYC was out this year but will be in it the next 2 years. Racing starts at TYC on Friday and on Saturday we start the fleet on the distance race which heads then to the South Shore. As a reminder to our TYC fleet to plan for 2024, we have multiple boats who could compete in any of the available divisions — Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker and Racer/Cruiser. This is a great time of year to participate and show that TYC can compete on the lake and at the parties. You can incorporate cruising into the boat deliveries pre and post regatta and it's a perfect opportunity to enjoy the clubs around the lake. The LPRC Committee is composed of members of all the clubs and CSA. TYC club reps were Kevin Blank, Wayne Sewing, Wayne Jablonowski, and myself. 




