



Farewell to TYC's first Mamadore

Guy Geller, Charter Member #1, Founding Commodore

Forty-four years ago, Pat Geller put out a signup sheet on the counter of the Liberty Marine Ship's Store for anyone that might have an interest in forming a yacht club. This was a few weeks before more formal discussions took place about starting a yacht club in the general area of Bayou Liberty. Chuck Fleming and I kicked the thought around for several weeks. He and I were the only avid sailboat racers having to sail to New Orleans on Friday nights, race Saturday, sometimes Saturday and Sunday, then sail back across the lake to go back to work on Monday.

More in depth planning took place in the local restaurant, Meyer's Old Europe, leading to a meeting in the fellowship hall of St. Genevieve church. Pat repeatedly typed and retyped articles of incorporation, by-laws, and several forms, etcetera on the Liberty Marine IBM Selectric typewriter. Pre-computer days required the total retyping; there was no saving documents.

Pat, as the wife of the first Commodore for three years was dubbed "Mamadore" by someone. I was never wild about the title, but it stuck for her and the next few wives of the following Commodores. She became the most dedicated, do everything person for Tammany Yacht Club for the next seventeen years before we left Slidell. She was one of the founding members of the First Mates. Jan Pecunia, Mary Brisbi, Anna Boos, and many others were instrumental in the growth of the social aspect of TYC. She tended bar, cleaned toilets, let her name be used on the State Liquor license, even after we had moved out of state.

Sadly, two months to the day, in the Senior Center in Tylertown, Mississippi, on September 7, 2023 at the age of 84, she gave up her sixty-six years as my wife and partner.

I was touched by the number of Tammany Yacht Club members who made the one hundred miles trip to celebrate her life. Approximately one hundred other friends flew and drove hundreds of miles to pay their respects to the small dynamo that was respected and loved by so many. They found their way to the little church that has been her family's church since 1883.

I can only express appreciation and love to those who made the trip and those who sent cards.

Medical grey-beards, have given me a few short months, before my number will be up, that qualifies me for hospice. The nurses and staff of Hospice Compassus are taking good care of me. Those who know me know that my early years were not a bed of roses, but since my eighty-seventh birthday in September I have absolutely no regrets for a thoroughly full life with an untold number of friends throughout the country and even in Europe. My wife, my partner, my friend, I have been told is waiting for me to rejoin her. I am more of a "dust to dust" person, we shall see!

I saw many of you on September 29th, maybe for the last time. Beside three children, eight grand-children, nine great-grand-children and four great-great-grand-children, my legacy is Tammany Yacht Club. Please let it grow and flourish. Thank you for the many years of joy!



FROM THE BAR

From the Bar

Nadja Salerno-Sonnenberg was born in Rome, Italy. Soon after Nadja's birth, her parents separated. During her early years, her mother supported the family working as a pianist and public-school teacher. On Sunday afternoons, friends gathered around the family piano to hear her mother play and her brother sing. At age 5, Nadja was given a violin so that she could participate. At age eight, her musical skill was evident, and at the urging of her teacher in Rome, the entire family moved to the United States to further her musical training. They settled in Cherry Hill, New Jersey.

Nadja was accepted at The Curtis Institute of Music. With an acceptance rate of 4%, it is one of the most selective and prestigious music schools in the country. At Curtis, Nadja was learning both English and music with students who were twice her age and size. However, it was not all academics. She was, according to on-line notes, reprimanded for dropping water balloons from the 4th story and hiding behind the organ pipes to read comic books, events that helped her earn the title of class clown. After six years of studying at Curtis, she continued her education at the world-renowned Julliard School in New York City.



Nadja's first debut, at age ten, was with the Philadelphia Orchestra, and since that time she has performed with virtually every major symphony orchestra in the world. Many of us were introduced to her at The Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra where she has been a featured performer. She has over 20 recordings available online. She also wrote "On My Way", an autobiography written for young adults. She was a frequent guest on the "Tonight Show" with Johnny Carson, and has

appeared on "60 Minutes", "Live from Lincoln Center", "Sesame Street" and "Dharma and Greg". Her documentary "Speaking in Strings" was nominated for an Academy Award. She is currently professor of graduate violin, director of chamber music, and director of Loyola Strings at Loyola University's College of Music and Fine Arts. Her other awards are too numerous to mention here.

In 1997 Nadja severed the tip of her left hand "pinkie" finger while chopping onions. The injury left her unable to play, so all performances were cancelled. During her recovery, she realized that being away from home 320 days a year, attending frantic rehearsals and practices, and being interviewed between airline flights was no longer a lifestyle that she wished to continue. In her transition from performer to teacher, she found great solace and inspiration from her Faith, which came to her late in life. Today, she will say that her Faith is the major motivation for everything she does or feels. Aside from the performances that she shares with her students at Loyola, Nadja only "comes out of retirement" to occasionally play at St. Louis Cathedral in New Orleans and Our Lady of Lourdes in Slidell.

While still living in New Orleans, Nadja began to investigate all the Caribbean Islands because she wanted to live on the water and leave New Orleans. As fate would have it, her friend Jaime invited her to lunch with Jaime's parents who lived across the lake. Nadja drove to their house, not aware that the community she was driving through was a water community. Steve and Cathy Pierce, Jaime's parents, welcomed her at the door. Nadja noticed immediately that they lived on the water. They said "We all do here!" After a terrific meal and wonderful conversation, Nadja not only had two more fabulous friends, but a realtor as well. Thoughts of the Caribbean vanished, and within a month, she bought her house on Carr Drive here in Slidell. Shortly after adapting to her new water surroundings, Rene Marques, TYC's Rear Commodore, helped her find a center console fishing boat. Life on the water was established!

At Tammany Yacht Club, Nadja is a member of the Nominating Committee and will be working to select the slate for next year's Board of Directors. You will often find her helping out in the kitchen and cleaning up after Thirsty Thursdays and Steak Night. When asked why she volunteers to clean up she said "I have learned humility through my Faith and I genuinely love the Club and all its members...it makes me happy to do so."

What a wonderful compliment!
