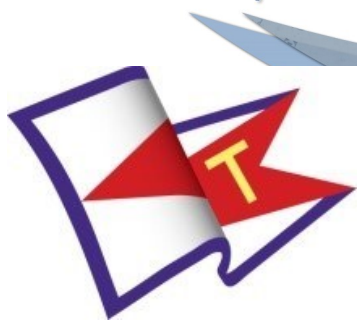

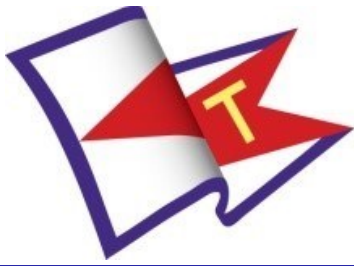

With our fall weather in full swing, don't forget Wednesday night sailing. Anyone interested in riding along, be at the dock in boat shoes by 5:45 pm.





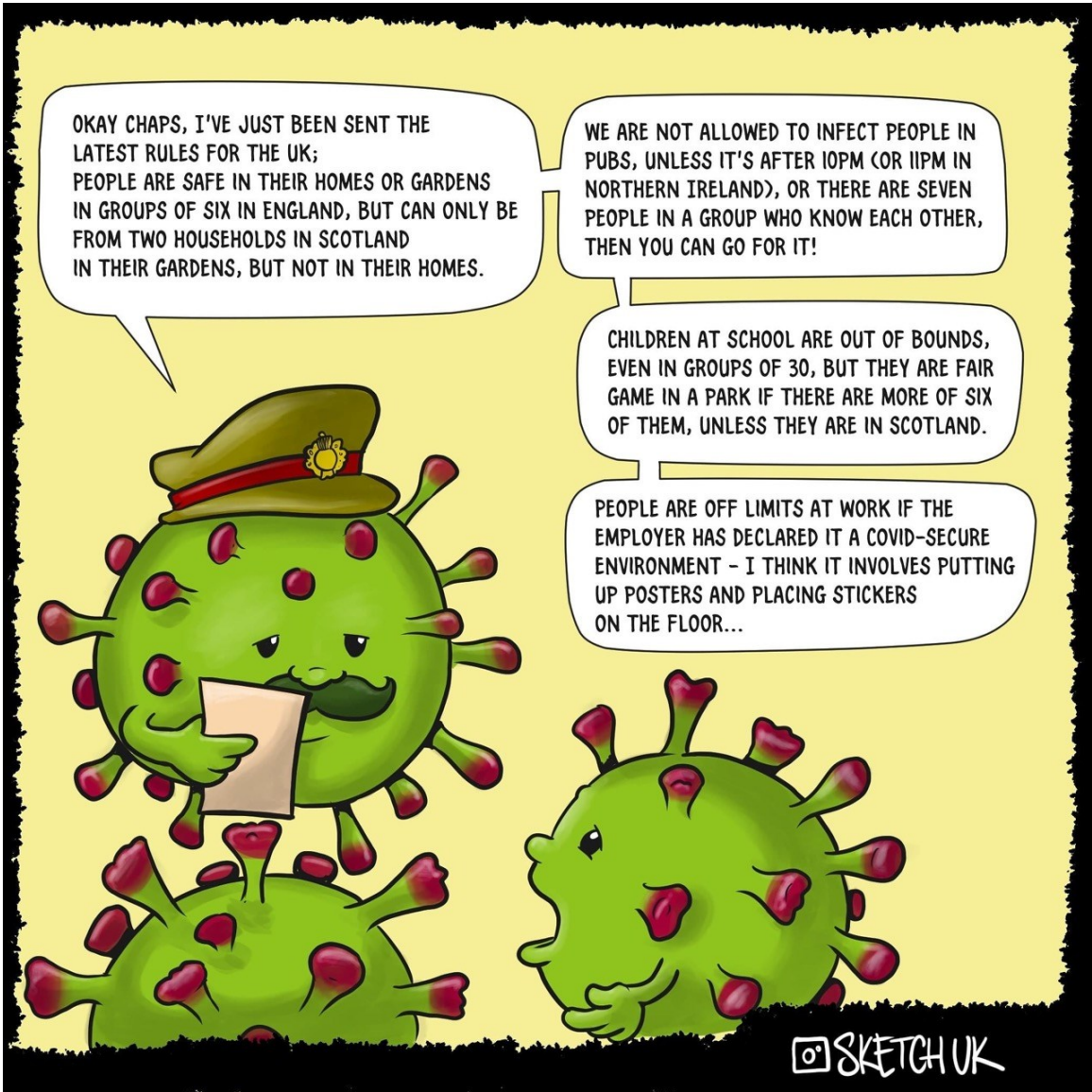
You're Invited

Remember we are still masking so wear yours into the club and we are still practicing social distancing. We are pleased that we have seen evidence of both practices in our recent events!!





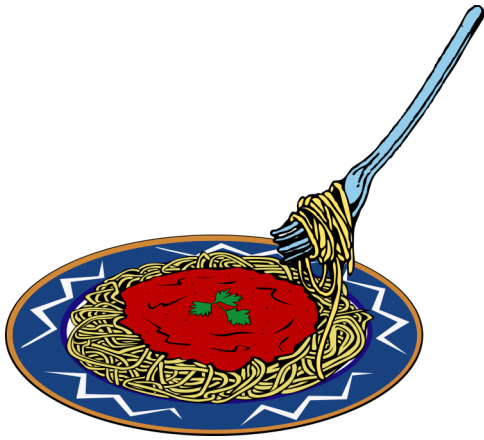

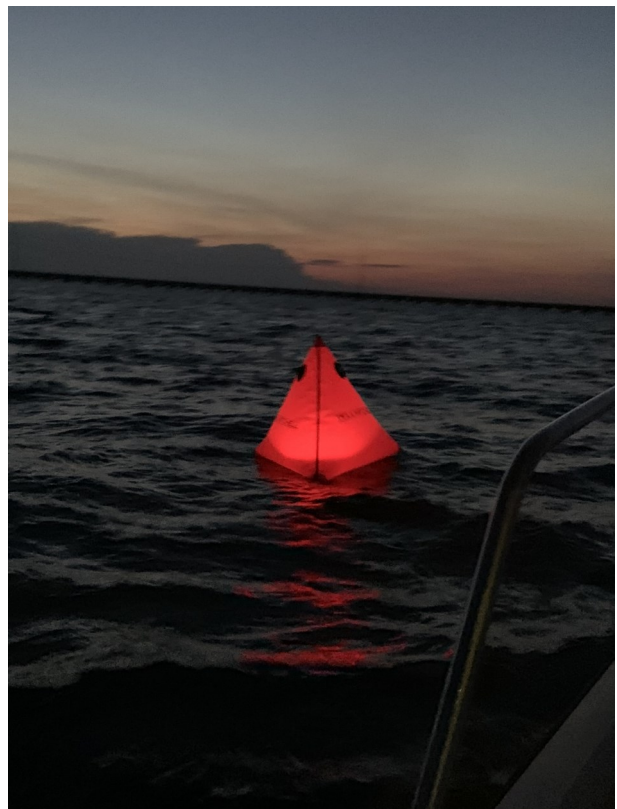

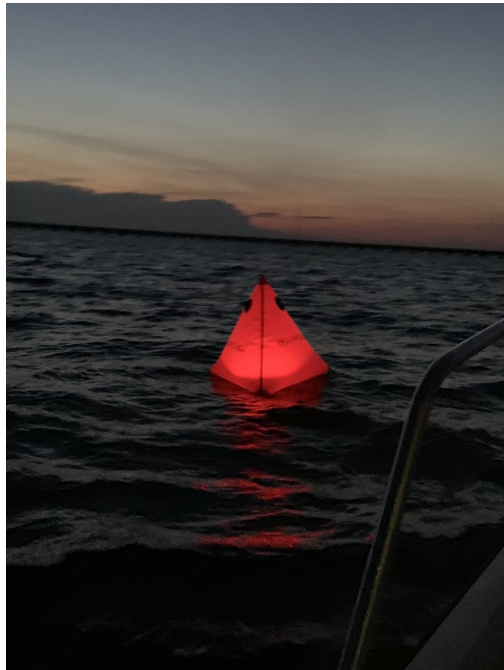
















## What is the GYA?

GYA is the Gulf Yachting Association. The GYA is comprised of over 30 yacht clubs in the Gulf of Mexico area. A list of the member clubs can be found on the GYA website.

## What is the purpose of the GYA?

According to the GYA website, the GYA was formed in 1901 to encourage and promote the racing of sailing yachts by amateur sailors. The GYA provides educational and training programs to further promote the sport of sailing.

## Where does TYC fit in with the GYA?

TYC is classified as a general member of Area D and individual members are entitled to reciprocity.

## What are Reciprocal Privileges?

TYC membership in the GYA allows individual members to visit other GYA clubs. The larger clubs have on site restaurants. Some clubs allow visitors use of their pools, and other amenities. Members are allowed one free night docking, with advance notice.

## What is necessary to visit another club?

Your up to date TYC membership card is proof that you are an active member. Participation varies by club and it is best to check with a member club before visiting. Different clubs have different requirements. Sometimes a club will require a letter from your commodore stating that you are a member in good standing. Some clubs require you to apply for a temporary membership prior to your visit or during a special event.

During the Covid pandemic, clubs have established different policies. Always check with the member club before your visit. Restrictions vary from state to state.





# LPRC



The Lake Pontchartrain Racing Circuit was established in 1985 by the four Gulf Yachting Association affiliated clubs: New Orleans Yacht Club, Southern Yacht Club, Pontchartrain Yacht Club, and Tammany Yacht Club. The event was, and continues to be, a milestone of cooperation between these organizations. The intention was to hold a series of races on Lake Pontchartrain to determine an area champion and establish a regatta that would eventually grow to an event of national prominence.

The LPRC Committee, consisting of four members from each club had the task of creating a regatta which would take advantage of the excellent fall sailing weather as well as providing a higher level of competition. The first regatta brochure announced, “what promises to be the largest and best attended regatta ever held on the Gulf Coast ... the winners of this series will legitimately be able to claim the handicap championship of the Gulf Coast”.

In the years since the first LPRC, the format has expanded to five races over two weekends. Each yacht club hosts races and parties which have included thousands of spectators and participants. The combination of tough racing and great parties is a proven winner.

Regatta entries have ranged from the first year’s 96 entrants to a high of 132. Twenty percent of the entries have come from outside Lake Pontchartrain, including as far away as Lake Michigan. Along with perpetual trophies for each of the two divisions, over 150 individual trophies are presented for the winners of each race in each class. Jackets are awarded to skippers of the “Best Boat” of the spinnaker and non-spinnaker divisions.

The Lake Pontchartrain Racing Circuit has established itself as the premier sailboat regatta in the Gulf Yachting Association. It is considered by many as the championship event for handicap boat

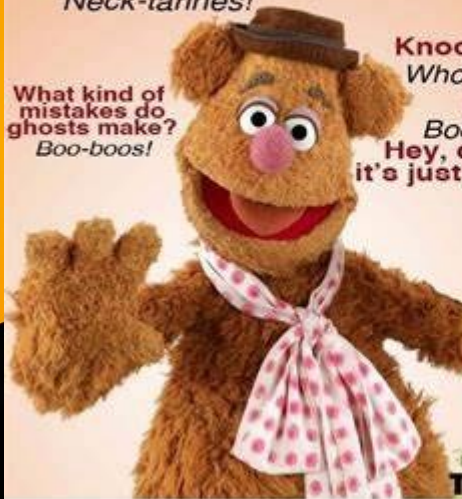

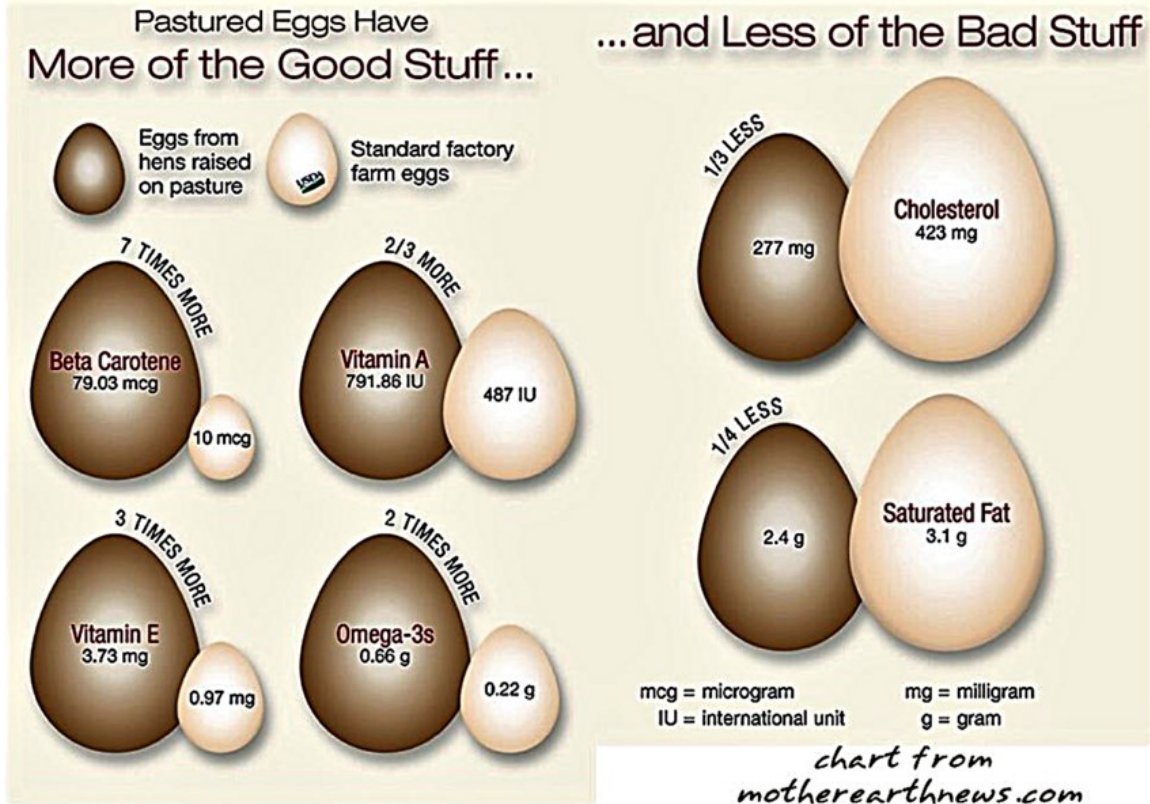

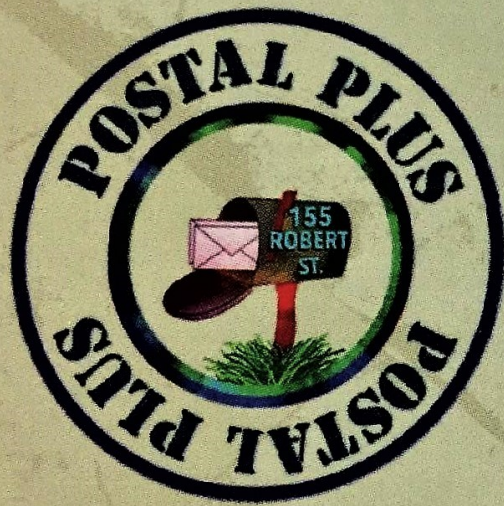
