

TAMMANY YACHT CLUB, A Bit of Our Past

REMEMBRANCES of Guy Geller

Our Spyglass Editor, Pauline Marques has asked me to resurrect the early years of Tammany Yacht Club at our beginning. Now it has been forty-one years since that beginning, so before my grey matter disappears completely, I will attempt to restore an old column for the archives of the club that had almost "no hope of lasting six months;" per the sages of Southern Yacht Club.

Several years have passed since a historical recap of Tammany Yacht Club has been presented. Commodore Jeff Hebert has asked me to synopsize nineteen years in one thousand words or less. Didn't make the thousand words so here are three instalments.

Chapter 25: From the Yacht Clubs of Louisiana. Laboriously written by Flo Scheib, the Secretary Emeritus of Southern Yacht Club "The Tammany Yacht Club is located on the north shore of beautiful Lake Pontchartrain in Slidell, Louisiana. It was granted a charter on July 25, 1980. Within a year this fledgling had been welcomed into the Gulf Yachting Association and had moved into a quaint bungalow near the banks of meandering Bayou Liberty.

The first Commodore, Guy C. Geller, was aided in this initial endeavor by Charles J. Fleming, Vice Commodore; H.G. Hagoort, Jr., Rear Commodore; Harry B. Grant, Secretary; and Ronald Vaughan, Treasurer. Board Members were Edwin Randle, Roland Decrevel and David Barnes."

A trio of businesses: Liberty Marine, Inc. a boat sales/marine store and boat yard owned by Chuck Fleming, Liberty Marina (100 + boats) and Bonfouca Marina (250 + boats) were at the heart of a thriving boating community in the mid-to-late seventies, early-eighties. Chuck was an ardent racing sailor who employed Pat Geller as store manager/girl Friday, for a number of years. At the time he and I were probably the only racing boat owners in the marina. Our club affiliation and competition was through our memberships with the New Orleans Yacht Club.

For me, racing entailed coming home from New Orleans on Friday, going to the boat, sailing back to New Orleans, spending the night on the boat, racing Saturday and Sunday and sailing the nineteen miles back on Sunday after the race. This went on three times a month from 1975 on. During that period an abortive attempt had been made to form a Bayou Liberty Cruising Club.

Chuck and I spent many hours and several bottles of rum evaluating the possibilities of forming a "Yacht Club" that would successfully overcome the problems of the ill fated BLCC. We decided that we should propose a "family oriented" organization to interested boaters using their love of water as the common denominator. Cruising, racing, fishing, small boats, big boats; professions would be secondary, if even considered. We discussed our thoughts with representatives of each interest. Harold and Jan Pecunia and Dave Barnes were sought out often for input and advice for their "power" expertise.

Ultimately, we arrived at the decision that 350 boat owners should be given the opportunity to express their desire, whether or not to participate. Chuck agreed to place a sign-up sheet on his store's counter in early February. Pat was to be the recruiter and would explain the concept. The signature was free. Very soon over one hundred twenty-five names had been recorded. We made arrangements to use the St. Genevieve Hall for an evening meeting. I don't recall exactly, but I think that probably fifty to sixty people attended.

The plan was to discuss whether or not to expend any more time and energy on this project. If we did, where would the funds come from to continue? The proposal was made that in order to reserve a membership, one would write a fifty-dollar non-refundable check. If the club was formed, that fifty dollars would be applied to initiation fees. The response was very favorable in the form of checks.

We sought advice from local attorney Gus Fritchie who was involved in the formation of Pinewood Country Club. He agreed to advise and incorporate us "pro bono" providing we did the work. We went about the business of writing articles of incorporation and by-laws. Chuck allowed Pat to type and retype during her workday at Liberty Marine. We tried for "non-profit status" the club couldn't qualify so we ended up as "not for profit". Part of this procedure required that we designate a board of directors.

We asked a number of potential members. It was not easy to find people that would commit a good portion of their free time. We ended up with eight people as the first board of TYC. A board meeting was held in Gus Fritchie's office with him presiding. Gus had been asked to participate as board member but declined. The first order of business was to hold an election to determine the officers. The results were recorded in Flo Scheib's quotation. We then reviewed the articles, made the necessary changes and finally we produced documents that were acceptable for submission to the state.

The "Tammany Yacht Club" was officially chartered on July 25, 1980.

On occasions I have been asked why the St. was omitted? Primarily, because a "St. Tammany Yacht Club" was formed in Mandeville in the 1930's. During my abortive research I was unable to unearth any significant facts other than its existence was pretty short-lived.

REMEMBRANCES of Guy Geller Part 2

We began by assigning priorities. Clubhouse location was uppermost. Chuck and I divided that responsibility, but in my spare time I was to design a suitable burgee. I decided that a swallow tail burgee gave more room for originality. I leafed through the now defunct "Lloyd's Yacht Club Register" to ensure that we would not duplicate an existing design. I submitted three possibilities to the board. Unanimous approval was given to the existing burgee. We vacillated on making the T white or gold. Each additional color costs more. I remember two ladies Jan Pecunia and Mary Brisbie in Chuck's store chanting "we want a gold T, we want a gold T!". That sealed it. Janice Cunningham made the first prototype and Charlie Ericson, one of the Lake's premier sail makers made the first production size burgee which is still in existence. You may be proud to know that the TYC burgee now is displayed in yacht clubs from Perth to Geneva and Panama Canal to San Juan Islands.

We located three sites on Bayou Liberty and one on Bayou Bonfouca. We considered floating the SS Cristobal, (member Captain Bob Jensen's ship) which was decommissioned from the Panama Canal route, to Bayou Liberty. There wasn't enough support for that idea. We quickly found that any property we considered suffered a tremendous appreciation immediately after Yacht Club was mentioned.

We arrived at the conclusion that leasing would be more feasible at that time. We entered into negotiations for several months for a three and a half-acre site surrounded on three sides by water. Preliminary plans were drawn and accepted. Three days prior to signing a long-term lease; I was notified by the lessor that the terms had changed. Instead of the full site a small rectangle of less than an acre with water on one side would be available for the same terms. After a telephone poll of the board, I wrote a letter ending negotiations.

The club had hosted a few social events, crawfish boil etc. in the Back of Liberty Marine. Luis Tonizzo had raced in the OSTAR "Observer Single-handed Transatlantic Race" aboard his Dufour 27 "Egret" finishing well and swearing to come back in '84 and win his class. We had an award presentation on the back of a truck for him with a key to the city from the mayor, a scroll from the Governor presented by the Secretary of the Senate.

All this was great but we still needed a Clubhouse. A house with a swimming pool adjacent to the marina came up for sale. We didn't want to make the same mistake, publicizing that it was for a club so Pat and I signed the purchase agreement. We made a few phone calls came up with \$18,000 which was the \$600 balance of the \$650 initiation fee from 30 people. Charter memberships were assigned in the order that the money was received. The first 100 memberships would be designated as Charter Members with those numbers to be retired upon the death of the member unless the spouse, male or female would ask the board to continue with that membership number. Then it would be retired. We had enough money to close on the house and we were off and sailing.

Encouraged by the response of prospective members we forged ahead. To be accepted in the Gulf Yachting Association the club had to meet stringent requirements, i.e. having a clubhouse, campaigning a "Flying Scott", having a distinctive burgee etc. I believe that there were eleven prerequisites in all. Our credentials were presented to the GYA by Southern Yacht Club's then Commodore Danny Killeen. Southern Yacht Club and Pontchartrain Yacht Club graciously co-sponsored TYC. Our membership into the Gulf Yachting Association was unanimously approved May 2nd, 1981.

The new clubhouse was purchased with existing red shag carpeting in the living room. Many hours of volunteer labor, much talent and numerous donations converted the master bedroom into a bar with a fire place. For the next few years, the facility was constantly changing with additions, decks, fences. The property next door came up for sale but the club didn't have the ability to purchase the one plus acre. So, Chuck Fleming bought it and held it until the club was able to buy it from him at his original purchase price. He absorbed the loss of the interest.

The third week end in October, 1981 we sponsored the first Single Handed 'Round the Lake Race. We had wanted to do something a little different so without going into all the mechanics, the challenge was accepted by 45 sailors with 31 finishing. That year "PM Magazine", a television public interest show, was active. They filmed close to 18 hours for a 12-minute segment that was ultimately reduced to six, because Kenny Rogers had done something significant that had to be aired that night.

Feminine participation included three generations, Jayne Lambke (Hunter 54) her mother Rea Mae Mann (Morgan 32) and her daughter Jenee aboard a Hunter (27). Interestingly, Rea Mae, I believe was either 62 or 64 at the time, was the one member of the trio who finished. She was fifth in her class. There were five classes. Overall winner was Al Gooch on Scampi his Cal 25.

The first week in March 1982 was the sailing of the inaugural "Two Against the Lake". We wanted to sponsor another different event. Bill Yauger gave birth to the idea of the now well-known event. "Two Against the Lake" was to be an endurance event in probably inclement weather so the first week in March was selected. The first event was a 67-mile steeplechase contested by 62 boats of which only four finished. Approximately 25 miles into the race a Norther' came through with gusts over 60 knots, the temperature went down to the mid thirties. Benz Faget and his date won aboard a Tartan 10 Meter. If I remember correctly, her total sailing experience consisted of reading library books to bone up for this, her first sailing weekend date.

Dr. Joe Arreteig became Commodore in 1983. He was the designer and innovator of the very soon universally used \$10.00 punch out bar card. I believe that a number of clubs in the GYA are still using them. TYC participated in the GYA "Offshore Challenge Cup" came in second but due to some point interpretation had to settle for third. Still not bad for a first outing, against very serious competition. The "Lipton Cup", the GYA one design championship in Flying Scots was another story. Out of 18 clubs we did beat two. I'm sorry to say that over the years, that is one event we haven't improved much.

1984 "OSTAR". As he had promised Luis Tonizzo won his class aboard the "City of Slidell" a Bruce Nelson designed 35-footer that Luis had built in New Orleans. He also beat all the monohulls in the class above him and had the record for the shortest distance traveled. Jim Bates, another TYC member placed fourth in the same class aboard "Big Shot" a shortened J-35. Not bad results for a young, small club on the bayou, competing against world class single-handed sailors! I still have the transatlantic chart that I used to track their daily progress via satellite. As an aside, they both had to sail their boats to England to start the race back from the Royal Western Yacht Club to Goat Island in Newport.

The early years were spent supporting sailing and social events. Cruisers and power owners began coming to events. Between Joe Arreteig, Bobby Boos, Doug Wilson, Mike Newell all accomplished chefs (I'm treading on dangerous ground here using only their names, there was an abundance of gifted cooking experts) we developed the reputation of having the best food in the GYA. It was all volunteer. The board members took turns, from tending bar to cleaning the heads. Our reputation as a warm welcoming club was set.

Next month: the birth of the LPRC, cruises, and preparations for the move to Eden Isles (Oak Harbor).






