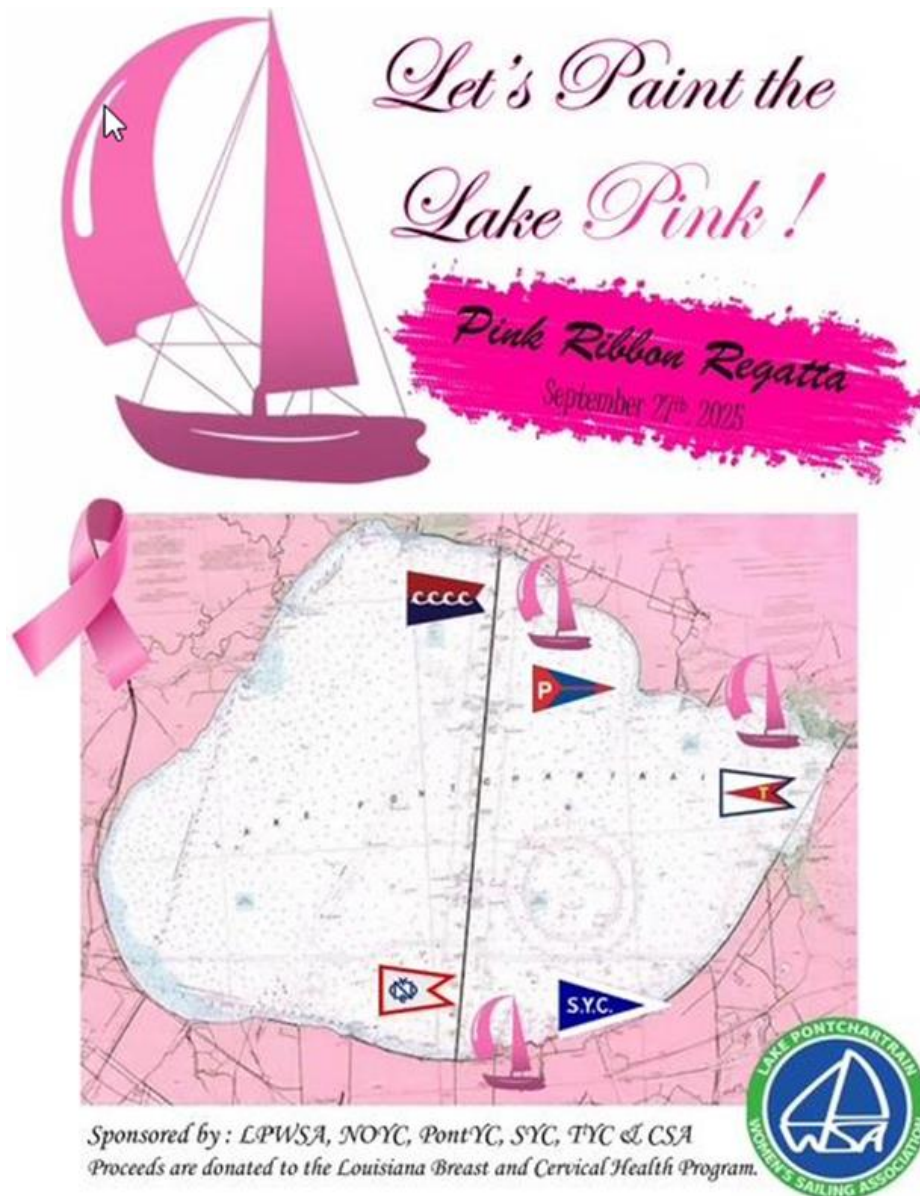
### **TYC Pontchartrain Foundation**



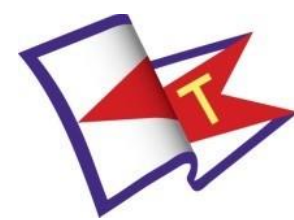

**Scott's Around the Race CHILI**  
For the Most (Korean) Sailors!  
1 flank steak, sliced on the diagonal  
Marinate 1-2 hours in:  
2 cups tomato sauce (oil or crushed seeds)  
1-2 cloves garlic, crushed  
1 cup dried onion  
6 Tbsp. soy sauce  
1 tsp. salt  
4 Tbsp. sugar  
Shake off marinade and broil or fry meat in a very hot pan, in small batches. Once meat for the chili is done, for the chili:  
1 cup black beans, not drained  
1 cup instant ramen (12 oz. box)  
2 Tbsp. fresh lime juice  
2 Tbsp. red wine vinegar  
1 cup onion, chopped  
1 cup celery, chopped  
1 cup bell pepper, red or green, chopped  
2 cans diced tomatoes  
1 can Rotel tomatoes  
4 Tbsp. garlic, minced  
3 tsp. chili powder  
1 Tbsp. dry cilantro leaves  
Place the leftover marinade (from the broiler) into the pot and add (onion, onion, and pepper. Cook until soft, add beans and tomatoes. Simmer until well blended then add the remaining ingredients. Mash about half the beans to help thicken the chili and simmer for 45 minutes (or so). To keep the meat tender, add the diced bell-pepper shortly before serving.

**How sailboat races are started, for our non-sailboat-racing members and spectators.**

Knowledge of the racing rules is an important part of the pre-race. There are things that you can do and can't do when approaching other boats in the area of the starting line.

Of course the idea is to cross the starting line going full speed in clear air at the exact time that the starting gun sounds. You don't want to be late and you don't want to be early. If you're late, you're on your own to catch up with the fleet and to try to salvage the race. All races are not won at the start, but most of them are lost there. A good start gives you a fair chance at winning. A bad start gives you a good chance at losing. If you're over the line early, you will have to return to the pre-race side of the line and re-start or you will be disqualified. The race committee will attempt to notify you that you were early, but it is your responsibility to determine if you were on time or not.

There are several tried and true methods of timing your start. Different methods work for different size boats and the method used will depend on the conditions and the experience of the skipper/competitor. The most commonly used method is known as the Vanderbilt start. This is a timed start, where you sail up to the starting line and determine the total time remaining before the start. You then sail away from the starting line for half that period of time, and sail back to the line arriving just as the starting gun is fired. With so many boats sailing toward or away from the line, it's important that you are sometimes a bit of a chameleon. In fact, in well-structured and regulated what method is used, most boats seem to get to the line at just about the same time.

It is the race committee's responsibility to control the start, using flags, signals and sound signals to communicate with the racers.

At 6 minutes prior to the start of the first class, the race committee sounds a single horn and drops all pre-race signals.

**Captain Dave's Marine Almanac**

Seven tropical storms already? Is it global warming, El Niño, an increase in the Atlantic's temperature or all of the above? No one knows for sure but you can't dispute Colorado State University's Dr. William Gray who predicted years ago that tropical storm activity would soon show a large seasonal increase and we'd better be ready for it.

Although seven tropical storms have already occurred this year, the statistical norm for June-July is only 1.2. Let's see...if the June-July activity is an indicator of the rest of the season we'd have around 50 storms in the Atlantic Basin this year. That would be a spectacular record. Don't get nervous, it won't happen. The past 2 months' activity is probably an aberration and the total number for the season is likely to be close to Gray's latest forecast which now stands at 15. Incidentally, the record is 21 which occurred in 1933. None the less, we'd better be prepared.

Now for a look at August weather. The normal highs are near 90 and records close to 100. The normal lows are in the mid 70s and records in the low 60s. It rains an average of 12 days during the month for a total of around 6 inches. The record is over 20.

THE RACE: Tammam Yacht Club's Silver Anniversary Celebration was definitely a mile-a-minute for our club. When the idea was tossed around in the beginning of the year about conducting a race in conjunction with our twenty-fifth birthday, Nigel Beale, Steve Jones, and I thought a distance race from the South Shore to the North Shore would be a fun way to kick off the festivities. In the spirit of the old "Great Lake Race", we decided the race should be one with a staggered start. A staggered start race is set up in a way that based on a boat's PHRF rating, the slower boats start first and the faster boats start later, thus allowing all boats to theoretically finish at the same time. A lot of work went into the preparation of this race beginning with a Skipper's Meeting. Social at Southern Yacht Club on Friday night and this event was especially rewarding to me. Commodore Conky Potts along with the staff of Southern Yacht Club provided our club a great evening of hospitality by allowing our Skipper's meeting to take place outside at the Tiki Bar next to their pool. In addition to this great setting, Southern also provided music and hors d'oeuvres for the large group of TYC members that showed up in support of this event.

The morning of our celebration was the big race. Wallace Pileon's of SYC and Bobby Tassin of TYC took Southern's "Patrol 11" out of her slip at 9:30 and began the trip out to set the starting line. Kokopelli and its crew of seven followed shortly afterward and out on the horizon we could see sail boats coming in from all directions. At 10:30 Endeavor with a rating of 222 was the first boat in a fleet of 16 sailboats to start the 20 mile long race. I wondered if Steven Murry and Al Goshak along with the crew of "Decision" and a rating of 34 had even left the dock.

The breeze started out light and for most of the day was moderate at best. Our start was not perfect but at least we were not over early. After passing the first two boats that started prior to us, Kokopelli rounded the "J" mark slightly ahead of Kacey Chabrenna and "Wine & Cheese". Since there was now breeze coming down from the NNW and very little breeze on the right, I decided to work my way to the left side of the course. As we worked our way North, Steve and Conky Choate on their Wavelength 24, "The Bear", turned the corner and were closing the gap between us. I thought to myself, "If The Bear likes this side it must be a good thing."

After about an hour and a half of feeling really good about our position on the lake and against the flow, the wind slowly died and then filled in from the right. Every boat that went right, made huge gains. I knew we were in trouble when Nigel Beale on "J Spot" popped his yellow chute and along with most of the fleet beat us to the "V" mark. When we were within a mile of Q, the wind line finally reached us and the breeze picked up to about 15 knots. We rounded Q on "After Shock" right out in front of me. With the finish line at Bayou Liberty 9.2 just 4 miles ahead, my sail trimmer, Jeff Lindheim, and I both felt we could make up what we had lost earlier. My new sails allowed me to point higher and sail faster eventually making it a little better boat in the "Under a 100K" Spinnaker Class. It was in that fictitious class that J Spot finished first just twenty seconds in front of Kokopelli. Two seconds behind Kokopelli was Haven Circuit coming in third. As for the big boys up ahead (like we could see them), Decision finished first, followed by Stanton Murry and Bess Fager on Fuzzy Logic with Karl Beale, Max Albert, and some finger from Pensacola, named Andy on Sapphire.

"Endeavor" taking first, with Miss Magic and her skipper Wolfgang Teller taking second. Past Commodore Guy Geller and Herb Sale on a Pearson 26 named "Relax" took third.

You can't start a race if there is no one out there to finish it. Members of the Coast Guard Auxiliary, Bill Swope and K. T. Porter provided their vessel "Wake Cool" as the exorcism boat. Len Heatherly, Jeff Hahert, and Jim Levent were all on board to record the finish times as each boat crossed the line. Thank each of you for your time and effort.

The race turned out to be just what we wanted, a fun race. I hope that this race can continue on and become another great Tammam Yacht Club tradition. Thanks again to everyone who participated both on and off the water. I hope to see everyone back out there for the TYC Single Handed Race scheduled for October 1<sup>st</sup>.
