### TYC Summer Sailing Program

Parents – This summer, get your kids away from the Video games and YouTube Videos. They can be outdoors with other kids learning a lifelong skill and a fun, non-impact sport that promotes both teamwork and self-reliance. Girls participate on an equal footing with boys. See the smiles on their faces when they learn they can control a boat by themselves using only the wind, and see the boost in their self-confidence that extends into all areas of their life, including school.

Kids – Come get out on the water, splash around, make new friends, and learn something really different. And have FUN doing it! It's not hard, any kid that wants to can learn. By the end of the session, you can be sailing your own boat, playing water tag with the other kids. Bigger kids can learn how to race. (It's an Olympic event) No previous boating experience is necessary. Age limits are generally from 7 to 15. Kids should be in reasonable physical condition (a medical release form is necessary), be comfortable in and around the water, and know how to swim. They should provide their own life jacket, to make sure it fits well. The club provides the boats and other gear.

# FLAG DAY - SATURDAY, JUNE 14TH






Flag Day is a holiday celebrated on June 14 in the United States. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The Flag Resolution stated "That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Flag Day was first proposed in 1861 to rally support for the Union side of the American Civil War. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation that designated June 14 as Flag Day. On August 3, 1949, National Flag Day was officially established by an Act of Congress. On June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday, beginning in the town of Rennerdale. New York Consolidated Laws designate the second

Sunday in June as Flag Day, a state holiday.

The United States Army also celebrates its birthday on this date.



Summer season is upon us and there are plenty of boats and people in the waters of our canals and in our lakes. Please wear your safety devices and be extra cautious as you navigate our busy waterways. Now seems like the perfect time to have a refresher on safe boating procedures and to check your required boating equipment.

#### **Boating Regulations**



#### Who Is Allowed to Operate a Motorboat or Personal Watercraft

If you were born after January 1, 1984, you may operate a motorboat over 10 horsepower or personal watercraft if you have successfully completed an approved boater education course OR if you are accompanied by someone over age 18 who has a successfully completed an LDWF-approved boater education course, if required. This exception does not apply to personal watercraft. Individuals must have their certificate of course completion in their possession while on the motorboat or personal watercraft. If you are a U.S. Coast Guard licensed captain, you are not required to take this course.

You must be age 16 or older to operate a personal watercraft. It is illegal for a person who owns or has charge of a personal watercraft to knowingly permit a person under age 16 to operate a personal watercraft. It is also illegal for a rental company to rent a personal watercraft to anyone under age 16.

#### Rules of the Road for Vessels

Violation of any of the below is considered careless operation of a vessel, a crime which carries a penalty of a fine of not more than \$300 or imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both.

- 1. Vessels passing head-on shall each keep to their respective right.
- 2. A vessel overtaking another vessel may do so on either side but must grant the right-of-way to the vessel being overtaken.
- 3. When vessels are on paths that cross, the vessel on the left will yield right -of-way to the vessel on the right.
- 4. Motorboats shall yield right-of-way to non-motor-powered boats, except when being overtaken by non-powered vessels, for deep draft vessels that have to remain in narrow channels, or when vessel is towing another vessel.

- 5. Motorboats must maintain a direct course when passing sailboats.
- 6. A vessel approaching a landing dock or pier shall yield the right-ofway to any departing vessel.



- 7. A vessel departing shoreline or tributary shall yield right-of-way to through traffic and vessels approaching shoreline or tributary.
- 8. Vessels will not abruptly change course without first determining that it can be safely done without risk of collision with another vessel.
- 9. If an operator fails to fully comprehend the course of an approaching vessel, he or she must slow down immediately to a speed barely sufficient for steerageway until the other vessel has passed.
- 10. Vessels yielding right-of-way shall reduce speed, stop, reverse, or alter course to avoid collision. Vessel with right-of-way shall hold course and speed. If there is danger of collision, all vessels will slow down, stop, or reverse until danger is averted.
- 11. Vessels will issue warning signals in fog or weather conditions that restrict visibility.
- 12. No mechanically propelled vessel shall be operated to traverse a course around any other vessel underway or any person swimming.
- 13. In a narrow channel, vessels will keep to the right of mid-channel.
- 14. Vessels approaching or passing another vessel shall be operated in such manner and at such a rate of speed as will not create a hazardous wash or wake.
- 15. A seaplane on the water shall in general keep clear of all vessels and avoid impeding the navigation of all vessels.
- 16. All vessels shall be operated at reasonable speeds for given conditions and situations and must be under the complete control of the operator at all times.
- 17. No person shall, under any circumstances, operate a vessel in excess of an established speed or wake zone.

18. No vessel or person shall obstruct or block a navigation channel, entrance to channel, mooring slip, landing dock, launching ramp, pier, or tributary.

- 19. Vessels shall keep at least 100 feet clearance of displayed diver's flag.
- 20. Operator shall maintain a proper lookout.

#### **Personal Watercraft**

TYC Spyglass

You must operate personal watercraft in a careful and responsible manner. Avoid operating around fishermen, anchored vessels, or swimmers. It is illegal to:

Operate a personal watercraft between sunset and sunrise without U.S. Coast Guard approved navigation lights.

Weave the personal watercraft through congested waterway traffic.

Jump the wake of another vessel when visibility is obstructed.

Operate in a manner that requires swerving at the last possible moment to avoid a collision.

Chase, harass, or disturb wildlife with your personal watercraft.




